# FINANCIAL REPORT AND ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

I. Elephant Newsletter No. 1 and No. 2.

An estimated amount of U.S. \$2,000+ was spent by the Department of Biology of Wayne State University and the editor toward the production of Elephant Newsletters 1 and 2.

II. Elephant No. 3. (Note: the name of this publication is now Elephant.)

Following the informal Elephant Interest Group (EIG) meeting during the 58th annual meeting of the American Society of Mammalogists, and the decision that a U.S. \$3.00 subscription be charged to help defray costs incurred by publication of Elephant Newsletters, more than 100 individuals and institutions have contributed toward the production of Elephant No. 3. Contributions ranged from U.S. \$1.00 to U.S. \$1,600.00; a total of U.S. \$2,419.54 Of this amount, U.S. \$819.54 was deposited in a special Wayne State University (WSU) account called "Elephant Research and Development" and the rest to be released from another WSU account.
