Nancy L. Canepa is Associate Professor of French and Italian at Dartmouth College, where her research and teaching interests include early modern Italian literature and the history of the fairy tale. She recently edited Out of the Woods: The Origins of the Literary Fairy Tale in Italy and France (1997), and her study of Basile, From Court to Forest: Giambattista Basile's "Lo cunto de li cunti" and the Birth of the Literary Fairy Tale, will be published in 1999. She is currently working on a complete translation of Lo cunto, as well as on a study of the hybridization of literary genres in seventeenth-century Italy.
