BCG vaccine protects patients from tuberculosis, and other viral infections. Since COVID-19 has similar symptoms, people believe the BCG vaccine may provide immunity against COVID-19.

World Health Organization has <u>cautioned against</u> using the BCG vaccine as prevention or treatment for COVID-19 due to lack of clinical evidence.
