A NOTE FROM THE EDITOR

Dear Fellow Members of the Elephant Interest Group,

The general response to the first Elephant Newsletter was most encouraging. The overall feeling conveyed was that the establishment of the Elephant Interest Group was long overdue. Readers were particularly appreciative of the references and requested that this service be continued if possible.

This issue of the newsletter is late for several reasons. First, some individuals, via verbal and written communication, have stressed the importance of publishing the information requested in the questionnaire, especially information pertinent to current research on elephants in this current issue of the newsletter. For this reason, a letter was mailed in February to all members who had not yet returned their completed questionnaires. Second, we had to have a Computer Bibliographic Search Services (CBSS) done in early 1978 rather than in the late 1977 as previously anticipated. These plus other activities that the editor was engaged in resulted in delaying this newsletter.

The Biology Department of Wayne State University is generous in its continuing support of the production and mailing of the Elephant Newsletter. In particular I would like to thank Stephen De Voe.

The list of individuals and institutions known to be interested in elephants is rapidly increasing. At this writing, there are 237 names on the membership list and an additional 43 on the mailing list. It is the hope that this newsletter will continue to serve as a nucleus for attracting new ideas and will stimulate further interest in elephants.
