Nonviolence and Peacebuilding Bibliography and Donations to Libraries

Since 2006, the Education Committee has been working on a Nonviolence and Peacebuilding Bibliography for children and adults. It now lists over 1100 titles. Since June of 2006, there have been over 3,201 downloads of the Bibliography.

This bibliography is shared with public libraries and a university library, so they can select titles and Citizens for Peace then donates what they select. Livonia Civic Center Library, Redford, Westland, Farmington Hills, Dearborn Heights and Commerce Township public libraries have added books to their collections about peace and nonviolence. In 2017, Marygrove University's Library received materials to support their Masters of Social Justice Program, and in 2018 the Canton Public Library received a collection of books.

Through MelCat, Michigan's Electronic Library, these books are available to all Michigan residents.

Political Action Committee

During the summer and into the fall, members gathered signatures for a ballot proposal to end gerrymandering, which was on the November ballot and it passed.

The Michigan Department of Education asked for input on the social studies curriculum. A letter was written to urge them to add to the curriculum the benefits and dangers of nuclear energy. Members signed the letter and it was mailed on September 11th.

A letter was sent to Senators Debbie Stabenow and Gary Peters asking them to support legislation that allows immigrants to get drivers' licenses. Members signed it and it was mailed on November 13th.

The Season for Nonviolence – Jan. 30 – Apr. 4

We practiced Random Acts of Kindness (RAK); packed lunches for the homeless at the Birmingham Temple for Central United Methodist Church to distribute; had a book discussion on Michel Nagler's *The Nonviolence Handbook;* Livonia, Redford and Westland Libraries displayed books from their peace collections as well as children's art.
