Peace Collections & Bibliography

The 2019 Peace Bibliography was donated to the Oak Park Public Library at a cost of \$2905.82.

Bob Podzikowski (Oak Park resident) has been the contact person for this donation. The library appreciates the donation.

This brings our total **Peace Book Bibliography** donations to \$12,575.

The Libraries who received our donation since 2007 are Livonia, Commerce Twp., Redford Twp., Westland, Farmington Hills, Canton, Marygrove, Dearborn Heights, Schoolcraft Community College, Adam Cardinal Maida Alumni Library at the Saints Cyril & Methodius Seminary, and Oak Park.

Since 2007, the Education Committee has been working on a Nonviolence and Peacebuilding Bibliography for children and adults. It now lists over 1200 titles.

Since June of 2007, there have been **3,201 downloads** of the bibliography in **over 100 countries**.

This bibliography is shared with public libraries, so they can select titles and the Citizens for Peace then donates the materials.

Livonia, Westland, and Redford public libraries have added a link to their homepage to the Citizens for Peace website, so their patrons can easily access the Bibliography. Through MelCat, Michigan's Electronic Library, these books are available to all Michigan residents.
